The Community-Based Local Initiatives Project (CLIP 2) and the Civil Society Network for Peer Support and Localisation (ADA Türkiye) are pioneering initiatives that aim to strengthen the socio-economic and personal resilience of refugees and vulnerable members of the host community in Türkiye.

Co-financed by the European Union Humanitarian Aid and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and implemented by the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ), CLIP 2 and ADA Türkiye were initiated in 2021 to bring together NGOs who provide holistic, needs-based social services and to ensure long-term collaboration for dependability.

“A Resilient Future for Everyone” exhibition encompasses visuals and stories that document the experiences of CLIP 2 project participants.

We Leave No One Behind

ADA Türkiye's dedicated implementing partners operate in underserved provinces with a high proportion of particularly vulnerable refugees (Syrians, as well as refugees from Afghanistan, Iraq, and Iran) and host community residents facing significant challenges.

The locations characterised by immediate needs represent the core of the project's mission: **To provide essential support and ensure that even the most remote and vulnerable communities receive the assistance they deserve.**

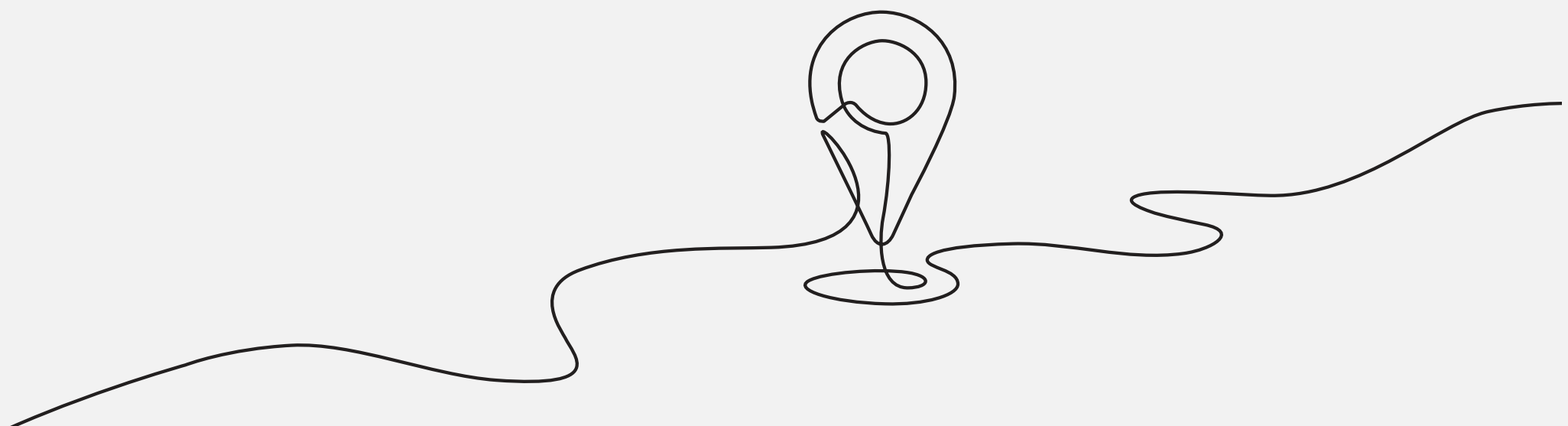


Localisation for Sustainable Impact

ADA Türkiye Network unifies organisations dedicated to providing comprehensive and tailored social services to refugees and vulnerable members of the host community in Türkiye.

Both the project and the network are built on an understanding that local NGOs constitute essential access points in refugee response. **It is local actors who possess precious insights into the local context, agility in responding to crises, and the capacity to engage and include the communities to actively participate in decision-making processes.**

We believe in the transformative force of empowering local actors with the tools and resources they need, for them to play a leading role in humanitarian and development aid. In this regard, ADA Türkiye's approach resonates with the outcomes of 2016's World Humanitarian Summit and OECD recommendations while exemplifying **localisation in a developed country context.**

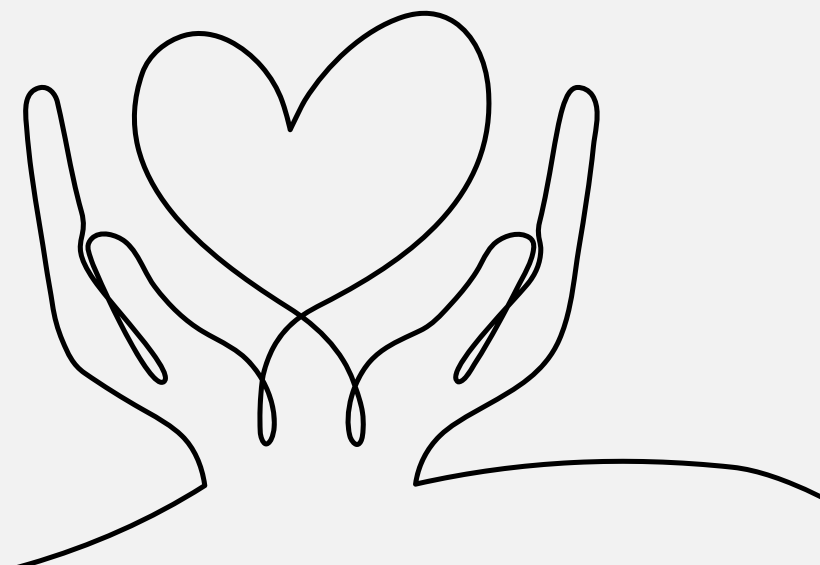


The Mentoring Approach: Empowering Local Initiatives

ADA Türkiye employs a unique mentoring approach, with a focus on knowledge and experience sharing on various levels between implementing partners.

Large-scale NGOs are given specialised support for capacity strengthening so they can be prepared to empower smaller, local initiatives. This collaborative effort forms a temporary working group named a “bundle.” Depending on the expertise of the organisation, the bundle increases the capacity of local initiatives in project management, organisational development and thematic skill development. Simultaneously, larger NGOs are empowered in their mentoring role with specific trainings and support structures.

Through this innovative approach, ADA Türkiye strengthens the overall impact of its partners and ensures the provision of rights-based services linked to the existing structures of the state.
